1. For decades, the Atlantic Ocean's <u>fabled</u> Bermuda Triangle has seized the human imagination with unexplained disappearances of ships, planes, and people.⁶¹²⁾

2. Some speculate that unknown and mysterious forces account for the disappearances, such as extraterrestrials <u>capture</u> humans for study, or the influence of the lost continent of Atlantis.⁶¹³⁾
