CHAPTER REVIEW 2 - 02 Daniel Kahneman



- Daniel Kahneman

〈1〉 Daniel Kahneman was born in 1934 in Tel Aviv while his mother was visiting Israel.

〈2〉 His parents were from Lithuania and his early years were spent in France, where the family managed to avoid Nazi persecution.

〈3〉 They moved to British Palestine in 1948 and Kahneman went to the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, where he took a degree in psychology.

〈4〉 After graduating he worked as a psychologist in the Israeli army, developing tests for evaluating officers.

〈5〉 In his mid-20s he went to the United States to do a Ph.D in psychology at the University of California, Berkeley, and in 1961 returned to Israel to take up a lecturing position, staying for several years.

〈6〉 Later research and teaching posts included the Universities of Michigan, Harvard, and Stanford.

〈7〉 He is currently an honorary professor in the psychology department at Woodrow Wilson School of International Affairs at Princeton.
